Of the recipients of a Federal Pell Grant from the Fall 2015 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree-seeking students, approximately 28.8 percent graduated within 150% time.

Of the recipients of a subsidized Stafford Loan (who did not receive a Pell Grant) from the Fall 2015 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree-seeking students, approximately 28.6 percent graduated within 150% time.

Of the students from the Fall 2015 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree-seeking students who did not receive a Pell Grant or subsidized Stafford Loan, approximately 16.2 percent graduated within 150% time.
